
To become the leading global authority on the ethical and effective publication of medical research to inform treatment decisions.

MEMBERSHIP TRENDS BY SECTOR




Certification vs. Certificates

 A certificate is a one-time acknowledgement that a course of study has been completed and the knowledge offered has been acquired

- A certification is ongoing and is tied to a profession or a function, not a course of study
 - Independent of training
 - Continuing education element
 - Ethics and discipline element

- Commitment to ethical and transparent data editorial processes and standards
- ✓ Leadership in upholding and fostering integrity and excellence in medical editing



Code of Conduct

Code of Ethics

A voluntary, professional resource for members

Code of Conduct

- Developed specifically for applicants and certificants
- Formalizes the obligation to work to acceptable standards of professional ethics and practices
- Enforceable: Conduct Case Procedures for complaints regarding professional conduct and structured appeals process




IMPACT OF ISMPP CERTIFICATION

2009 - Present




CMPP™— Certificant Awards By Year


ISMPP CMPP™ Certificants by Region






Workplace Culture and Management Views of ISMPP CMPP™ Credential Are Key Drivers of the Perceived Value




ISMPP CMPP™ Status Helped Secure New Positions Among Members (Industry and Agency) Recently Switching Jobs





Over 2-Year Period, Agencies Received Between 66 and 143 RFPs That Required or Preferred ISMPP CMPPTM Credential



Both Organizational and Personal Value Were Rated Highest by Agency Staff Members





Summary

- The impact of pursuing and obtaining certification is:
 - Increasing
 - Adds personal value
 - Adds organizational value
 - Playing a role in securing new positions
 - Ultimately leads to certification being requested and/or required of job applicants

Valued by Organizations

Position requirements:

- Degree in marketing, communications, or biology
- 5 years of business, pharmaceutical, or medical communications experience
- 2-4 years of solid publication planning experience
- Knowledge and understanding of industry guidelines
- CMPP status preferred
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office applications
- <u>Datavision</u>™ experience a plus

Education and Experience

- Bachelor degree (minimum), preferably in the health sciences or communications field; advanced degree or allied health degree a plus (PharmD, BSN, PhD, MS, RPh)
- 15 20 years of pharmaceutical and/or agency experience
- Active ISMPP Certified Medical Publication Professional (CMPP)
- Extensive experience estimating costs and developing budgets
- Prior supervisory experience and the ability to motivate others to attain goals
- Demonstrated leadership skills, both within the agency and with clients

for authors, sponsors and internal team members. The position requires a bachelor's degree or higher and 5+ years in publications, in-depth knowledge of GPP2 and ICMJE guidelines and the ability to maintain flexibility and foster teamwork in a fast-paced work environment. CMPP desirable.

A thorough knowledge of current regulations, guidelines, and compliance policies relating to medical publications is required. An ISMPP Certified Medical Publication Professional™ credential is preferred.
